Saturday 31st July & Sunday 1st August 2021 Notice of Race (NoR)

Organising Authority (OA): Royal Channel Islands YC (RCIYC)

1. RULES

- 1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS);
- 1.2. The Post Race Penalty, Advisory Hearing and RYA Arbitration procedures of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will apply (Ref. www.rya.org.uk/racing/racing-rules/racing-rules-guidance). The outcome of an RYA Arbitration can be referred to a protest committee but an arbitration cannot be reopened or appealed.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1. The sailing instructions will be available from the RCIYC and at www.rciyc.je/sailing no later than Monday 19th July;
- 2.2. The sailing instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and any supplementary sailing instructions that will be published on the official notice board at www.rciyc.je/sailing.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1. The official notice board is located on-line at www.rciyc.je/sailing;
- 3.2. From the warning signal until the end of each race, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

- 4. **ELIGIBILITY -** The event is open to all boats in the following SCHRS Hobie Cat classes:
 - 4.1. Class 1 rating equal to or less than 1.000
 - 4.2. Class 2 (including sub-classes 2a, 2a (spi) and 2b) rating greater than 1.000 up to and including
 - 4.3. Class 3 rating greater than 1.250

5. ENTRY

- 5.1. Eligible boats may enter the event by registering online at www.eventbrite.co.uk/o/the-royal-channel-islands-yacht-club-18654642776;
- 5.2. The cut-off date for entries is Wednesday 28th July;
- 5.3. Parental consent competitors under 18 years of age may enter by completing both the on-line registration and parental consent form. Persons-in-Charge aged 18 years and above shall provide a parental consent form for any crew member who will be under 18 years of age on 1st August;
- 5.4. To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all entry requirements and pay all fees.
- 6. **FEES** entry fees are as follows
 - 6.1. Two handed £25.00;
 - 6.2. Single handed £12.50;
 - 6.3. Dragoon
 - 6.3.1. Club boat £30.00 per boat (to include the RCIYC Cadet sailing fee for Club boats, i.e. each Cadet pays £15.00);
 - 6.3.2. Private boat £20.00.

7. SCHEDULE

- 7.1. Registration and weigh-in will take place between 1800 and 1930 hours Friday 30th July;
- 7.2. Saturday 31st July and Sunday 1st August all classes three back-to-back races are scheduled for each day;
- 7.3. Tidal information
 - 7.3.1. Saturday 31st July High Water 11:57 hours BST, Height 8.7m;
 - 7.3.2. Sunday 1st August High Water 12:44 hours BST Height 8.2m;
- 7.4. The scheduled time of the first warning signal on:
 - 7.4.1. Saturday is 0955 hours;
 - 7.4.2. Sunday is 1025 hours;
- 7.5. Where conditions are such as to prevent all three races being completed on Saturday, no more than one race may be carried over to Sunday, at the race committee's entire discretion;
- 7.6. Sunday 1st August no warning signal will be made after 1630 hours.

8. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 8.1. Boats may be inspected at any time;
- 8.2. [DP] Boats shall comply with RRS 78 (Compliance with Class Rules; Certificates) throughout the event.

9. VENUE

- 9.1. The event administration venue is the RCIYC;
- 9.2. The racing area is entirely within St Aubin's Bay.

10. COURSES

- 10.1. Courses will be set within St Aubin's Bay;
- 10.2. Appendix 1 indicates the approximate course layout and course identification table.
- 11. **PENALTY SYSTEM** the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty. This changes RRS 44.1.

12. SCORING

- 12.1.For all classes all races scheduled for Saturday and Sunday will count towards each day's place prizes, i.e.no result will be excluded;
- 12.2.For the purposes of determining the champion in each class, all races completed on Saturday and Sunday will constitute a series for all classes as follows:
 - 12.2.1. When fewer than six races have been completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When six races have been completed a boat's score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 13. **DATA PROTECTION** the use of data provided by an entrant to the OA is subject to the Data Protection (Jersey) Law 2018 (Ref. Policy statement located on the official notice board);
- 14. RISK STATEMENT RRS3 states that the responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - 14.1.They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event:
 - 14.2. They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
 - 14.3. They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
 - 14.4. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
 - 14.5. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
 - 14.6. The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
 - 14.7.It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to the venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event;
 - 14.8.Persons-in-Charge, and their crew, shall familiarise themselves with and observe applicable Government of Jersey (GoJ) Guidelines relating to Covid as they apply to this event (Ref. https://www.gov.je/health/coronavirus).
- **15. INSURANCE** Each participating boat shall be insured with current third party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 (three million pounds sterling or the equivalent in euros) per incident; this insurance shall include racing cover.

16. PRIZES


- 16.1. Place prizes will be awarded in each class, as follows:
 - 16.1.1. When three boats are entered first and second prizes only;
 - 16.1.2. When four or more boats are entered first, second and third prizes only;
- 16.2. Subject to GoJ Covid restrictions, it is intended that the presentation of trophies and place prizes will take place in the RCIYC as soon as possible after 1900 hours Sunday 1st August.
